continue our pursuit of a more equitable and inclusive world. We named the André Apartments (pictured on cover), at East Washington Avenue and 6th Street in Madison, to honor his legacy. The new space for Red Caboose Child Care Center, where André was a student, is located on the ground floor, with 38 affordable apartment units above, eight of which are designated as supportive units for people with disabilities.




